Tech Tips & Tricks - Solid State Drives by Josh Curtis

It was a little over three years ago that solid state drives (SSD) caught the attention of the techies (aka computer geeks). However, it has taken all that time for the prices to come down where a SSD is a viable option for consumers.

Some of the following concepts may be confusing, so here is a little background to help you out. The hard drive in your computer is the piece where ALL of your information is stored. The hard drive itself is very similar to a record player...with a rigid disc (record) that spins and an arm that moves across the disc to read the data (like a needle). On the other hand, a SSD is a hard drive with NO moving parts...similar to USB flash drive or the memory card in your digital camera. Unlike USB drives and camera cards, SSD are built specifically for computers and can hold a lot mor information.

A SSD has three major advantages over the typical drive:

 Speed Speed Speed - Typically, the hard drive is the bottleneck of any computer. However, with no moving parts, a computer with a SSD is typically 4-5 times faster than a computer with a

- typical HDD! Check out the times of a computer that was upgraded with a SSD:
- 2. Energy With no moving parts, the SSD's require less energy to run than your typical hard drive. Secondly, because your tasks are completing 4-5 times faster, your computer is only working hard for 20%-25% of the time it used to...a huge energy savings over a typical hard drive.
- 3. Reliability Typical drives are very fragile and even a small bump or drop could prove detrimental. Again, with no moving parts, there are very little components that can break. All this makes your data much more secure and reliable...especially for laptop computers.

So how much do they cost? A SSD suitable for the average computer is under \$150-\$200. Of course, if you can't do it yourself, you'll have to pay someone to make the migration for you.

If you're looking for a faster computer, maybe even a new computer, consider a SSD. A SSD in your old computer may just be faster than a regular drive in a new computer.

Register to vote: October 9th, 2012 is the deadline

Absentee ballots: The last day to apply for a civilian absentee ballot is 5:00 PM on the Tuesday before the election (October 30, 2012)

Absentee ballots must be returned to the County Board of Elections Office by 5:00 PM on the Friday before the election - November 2, 2012. Note that POSTMARKS DO NOT APPLY.

If hand delivering, only the actual voter may return their ballot.
