- Board unanimously approved to move forward with a MVRA Shredding Event to take place in the spring. Both paper and electronics collections are being considered. Cost to neighbors would be \$5 for this service.
- Request that newsletter stress to neighbors that when they encounter a contractor they like, they should let the contractor know about advertising in our newsletter. This would raise awareness of their services at a very reasonable rate: \$10/quarter page; \$15/half-page; \$30/full page.

them and their friends to slow down. If you're an adult that is speeding...c'mon now...slow down for the few hundred yards it takes to get to the edge of the neighborhood. Don't force people to put up 'Your Speed Is ..' signs and lighted stop/speed limit signs.

In regards to walking at night...unless you are wearing reflective clothing or some sort of light DRIVERS CANNOT SEE YOU! We have received many reports of near misses. You can get a nice reflective vest on Amazon for \$9.99 (or at the hardware store if you're old school). You probably own car insurance, health insurance, life insurance...spend another \$10 on a high visibility vest for walking at night...relatively speaking it is a steal. Make yourself visible.

My last thank you is to the Doody family who where ever present in the planning, preparation, clean-up, etc for the entire event. The event was a huge success - owed entirely to all the help of all that I mentioned and more.

This year, our first year, we honored our neighbor Mike Riotto who was diagnosed with Multimyeloma 5 years ago. If you are not familiar with Multi-Myeloma it is a terminal blood cancer with no known cure. People who have this cancer often appear healthy for a time, but their entire bone structure gradually weakens over time and cannot recover. This cancer involves a complete commitment to a rigorous treatment and expensive drug regimen just to prolong your life.

Mike has served the neighborhood and the MVRA board for many years in every aspect. Mike has served as the Warwick County judge of elections for the past 10 years. He does a lot of work with Gilda club, a group named after Gilda Radner that helps families affected by cancer, helping other families who are living with cancer. When Mike was diagnosed with an incurable cancer, he decided to fight it with the energy he has devoted to all the community causes he has been involved with. For the last 5 years, he has organized a team to walk in the 'Light the Night' Bucks County walk that has raised tens of thousands of dollars to find cures for cancer.

We had more than 60 people attend Casino Night to honor the entire Riotto family. The main entertainment for the evening was the mini-casino that featured three Black Jack tables and one Roulette table. Although many of the attendees were not "gamblers" in the traditional sense, it didn't take long before all four tables were jam-packed with players. So much of the success is attributed to awesome dealers (the same middle-aged poker players that (Continued on page 13)


Great American Cleanup by Phyllis McCabe
